At the Town Council meeting on 9.2.24 the Town Council's Emergency Action Plan was reviewed and the resolution 648/24 was passed

<u>RESOLVED</u>:- to refer to the action plan to Wem Area Climate Action for comments and consider at a future meeting.

Wem Area Climate Action has now reviewed the document and their comments are copied below and highlighted in yellow on the plan

The Secretary and Chair of WACA, Malcolm Adkins have worked through the Wem town Council Climate Emergency plan this morning. We also looked through the biodiversity plan. We welcome this addition and think it could be linked as part two of the overall plan. As the Council has rightly identified this area is key to our practical climate response.

Within the biodiversity plan, we are particularly concerned to focus on the following areas, Rivers and watercourses, wetlands, trees and grasslands. We would also like to focus on particular animals and insects which need specific support, which could well be an area to encourage community engagement. There is focus on new build biodiversity net gain but perhaps less so in shared or community spaces.

We did not have time on this occasion to look through Wem Rural's climate plan, but, as our name suggests (Wem Area Climate Action) we are keen to look at the whole and hope working together is also a priority for the Council, as we certainly need connectivity to promote biodiversity. We have recently welcomed Helen Mc Cabe, Wem Rural Clerk attending WACA meetings.

I am attaching a copy of the plan with highlighted additions. These comments are meant to be helpful and hopefully adding to the scope of the council's response.

WACA is of course committed to taking every opportunity at every local event to encourage and inform the community of changes they can make to mitigate climate change and reduce their carbon footprint. We are currently working with Marches Energy Agency and Community Climate Connectors to promote low-cost energy home improvements, reducing bills and carbon footprints.

Wem Town Council Climate Emergency Action Plan

This climate change action plan was last updated in October 2022 when the following recommendations were identified as the Town Council's key priorities in 2022-23.

Priority 1 - Planning Applications – The Town Council should submit comments on every planning application for domestic and commercial new builds, extensions, conversions that request conditions relating to use of appropriate insulation / the installation of low carbon heating systems / use of low carbon products in the build installation of EV charging points / tree planting etc. The Working Party consider that this is essential to ensure that comments about low carbon development become more mainstream so that in time they can become material considerations. Edward Towers is to seek advice from Shropshire Council for suggestions on the type of comments that could be considered – 2024 this is considered in all planning applications. Any development should take into account embedded carbon in the infrastructure.

Priority 2 - Installation of rapid vehicle charging unit in the town - Working party consider this to be a priority as there is no rapid vehicle charging unit in the area. This project will be dependent on Shropshire Council permitting the use of its car parking spaces for this purpose and there being sufficient electricity supply in the area. The Bowensfield car park has been discounted as the electricity supply is already at capacity in this location – 2024 update - Shropshire Council are still to install electric charging units and these are not fast chargers Chargers on lampposts?

Prioirty 3 – To consult with schools and youth groups in Wem to seek views of young people to understand what Wem related projects / initiatives the Town Council should progress to tackle the climate emergency. Work will need to be carried out prior to this to identify the best way to communicate with young people either through use of a digital survey or paper based questionnaire. This has not been progressed by the Town Council however WACA are working with Thomas Adams School on projects. Broaden involvement to include the whole community. WACA involvement in 2024 has been to attend all community events to inform and highlight Climate issues
